

Septic Systems: We All Have Them ...

In Ramsey Ridge all homes have in-ground septic systems for household sanitary waste water disposal. Properly maintaining the system is your key to headache-free property maintenance. It comes down to two things:

- Have your system pumped out and inspected at least every 2-3 years. Annually is best.
- Be mindful of what you put down the drain. Excess solids can clog the system. Chemicals and solvents can deactivate necessary biologic activity within the system.

The Delaware Department of Natural Resources (DNREC) regulates all septic systems —- installations, pumpouts, inspections, and repairs through licensed independent contractors. Be sure your contractor(s) are Delaware-licensed.



The Ramsey Ridge Service Corporation also regulates the location of all septic systems (via ARC approvals) and can enforce the proper maintenance and operation of septic systems. Please review the deed restrictions for more information. Article IV Section 3 covers design and location. Article IV Section 4 covers septic system maintenance and operation. The deed restrictions can be found on the Ramsey Ridge website.

Spring Cleaning ... your To-Do List

- Review your property for seasonal maintenance needs.
- Keep you trees and bushes from excessively growing into or over the streets.
- Check the condition of your mailbox ... does it need a maintenance "refresh"? (Note: Mailbox replacements need ARC approval)



Protect Our Community—The People and The Landscape

<u>Drive the speed limit of 25 mph</u>. Be especially mindful on Dewberry Drive since it is a long stretch of road. Speeding saves the driver a miniscule amount of transit time in Ramsey Ridge, but it can pose real hazards to the pedestrians and cyclists in our sidewalk-free community.

<u>Avoid street parking on cul-de-sacs</u>. Even short periods of parking raise the real risk that other drivers and delivery trucks will not be able to pass by without causing damage to our cul-de-sac landscape investments. If you live near a cul-de-sac, please share this request with your household, guests, service providers, and contractors.



Resident Reminders

Architectural Review Committee (ARC): The ARC is involved with exterior matters on your home and Lot. When thinking about an exterior project (e.g. additions, landscaping, recreation, trees), please contact the ARC as early as practicable in your planning. If in doubt, please err in favor of contacting the ARC. The ARC Project Change Request Form is available at www.ramseyridge.com. Thanks to all who participate in or help to make the ARC process successful!

<u>Yard Signs</u>: The only signs allowed in Ramsey Ridge are normal real estate "For Sale" signs. All other signs are prohibited unless approved in writing by the ARC (see above). We strongly discourage other signage in order to keep our community clutter-free and beautiful. This policy is important to note for contractors doing work on your home — please let them know. We appreciate your help in keeping our community sign-free.
